Miranda and Kelsey-Anne are experienced music educators and we are very excited to have them as part of the OSANSW Committee.

Thank you and congratulations to Robyn Staveley for another successful year of Levels Courses. The feedback from participants was very positive. Thank you to presenters, Sue Lane, Peta Harper, Rosemary Clark, Audrey Fine, Susie Davies-Splitter, Elaine Slawski and Robyn Staveley for their care and support of the Orff pedagogy and for providing participants with fun experiences and wonderful ideas for the classroom.



2020 (January to August)

Our year began with the National Conference (Vision) in Melbourne. It was a fabulous week of sharing new ideas and repertoire with colleagues. I would like to congratulate VOSA on hosting this wonderful event. Congratulations also to all OSANSW members who presented at the conference, especially Virginia Esparraga who presented at a National level for the first time. Good luck to OSASA who have taken on the challenge of hosting the next National Conference. I am looking forward to Remix in Adelaide, January 2022.

In March things changed dramatically. OSANSW and ACT Orff, like all associations, were forced to put all events on hold. I would like to thank all members of the OSANSW Committee for their continued support throughout this difficult time. We have had to make some hard decisions over the past months and have always kept the best interests of our members as our first priority.

In May, we had planned to run our *2020 Two-Day Conference* in Canberra. This was a new event for us in response to feedback from members who requested that we consider hosting a state conference every year (instead of every two years). We were certainly looking forward to welcoming Rob Amchin as our featured presenter. Our huge thanks to conference convenors, Susan Curbishley and Alina Belshaw, for their amazing planning for this event. We know they were devastated when COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the conference but they are looking forward to revisiting those plans when restrictions have eased.

While our live events are on hold, OSANSW and ACT Orff have looked at other ways of supporting our members. We have hosted two *Online with OSANSW* events (*Musica Viva resources* and *Thursday afternoon drinks*). Both of these events were very well attended and provided a chance for our members to 'catch up' within an online setting. The Thursday afternoon drinks event was particularly effective as it gave our members a chance to have a chat about issues they were facing in regard to remote learning. Classroom engagement and ensembles dominated the conversation but there was also a chance for discussion about what schools were doing in terms of singing, using instruments and other resources. The feedback from both these sessions was very positive. We are looking at some more online events later this year before hopefully getting back to seeing everybody in person.

As a result of COVID-19 restrictions, the International Orff Schulwerk Forum Salzburg was held online in 2020. Six members of the OSANSW committee were able to attend this event and were involved in *Come Togethers, Discussion Groups, Lectures and Meetings*. It was exciting to share this experience with delegates from other Australian states as well as international delegates from many countries around the world. One of the highlights for me was attending the lecture, *The Legacy and Vision of the IOSFS*, by Barbara Haselbach, Shirley Salmon and Andrea Sangiorgio. I hope the Forum will make this lecture available for us to share with our members in the future.

For the first year since I have been involved with OSANSW we will not be running our Levels courses in September. Although we recognize that many COVID-19 restrictions will be lifted by then, we felt that participants may be concerned about the 'close' nature of this course, especially in the movement sessions. We will look at our timetable for 2021 and may offer more Levels throughout the year including Levels courses in regional areas.

Where possible, we have continued to have all of our courses endorsed by NESA (NSW) and the Teacher Quality Institute (ACT) so that participants can claim their Professional Development hours. The preparation

of these endorsements continues to be quite a time consuming process and I thank all OSANSW committee members who have been involved in preparing documents for NESA and TQI.

We have shared three *Bite Sized Bulli's* with our members since March. Our thanks to Sarah Powell for organising these publications. Roundtable of Instrumental, Vocal and Music Education Organisations (RIVMEO)

In response to the overwhelming concern of members The Orff Schulwerk Association of NSW (OSANSW) has united with more than a dozen other peak organisations and institutions to form a combined voice to government on the current crisis caused by COVID-19.

Inaugurated this week, the Roundtable of Instrumental, Vocal and Music Education Organisations (RIVMEO) has its first objective to *get NSW playing*, *singing and learning together*, *safely*.

The Roundtable is an unprecedented and substantial collaboration, representing tens of thousands of performers, teachers, conductors, and students in all corners of the state.

OSANSW has joined with the others to form the Roundtable, believing it will add strength and weight to the advocacy we and others are already doing on your behalf.

As a member of RIVMEO OSANSW is glad to be a significant contributor to this important work.



Recent decisions around the practice and performance of music in school, community and church settings have had deep and devastating effects throughout NSW.

With the playing, singing and learning of music in NSW substantially on hold, the combined effect on the health and wellbeing of individuals and the community is potentially profound.

The pandemic will be with us for some time. What we most need is an effective plan, based on authoritative research, to continue playing, singing and learning music as safely as possible.

The Roundtable is seeking to work collaboratively with the relevant authorities in NSW to develop evidence-based best practice models suitable to mitigate the risks associated with musical activities such as choirs and bands.

Roundtable working groups are currently:

- Planning a survey of the music community to gauge the effects of recent policy decisions,
- Undertaking a review of relevant, authoritative research in the field
- · Collating and evaluating current risk management plans for instrumental and vocal music
- Reaching out to relevant authorities in health and education (government and non-government).

The work of the Roundtable will build on and add weight to the work already done by its member organisations including [this association/organisation].

The Roundtable is auspiced by ABODA and BANSW. Its facilitator is Stephen O'Doherty, a member of ABODA and a former NSW MP.

Addressing this issue is both urgent and important, and we will continue to keep you up to date with developments.

In a year of firsts, the formation of the Roundtable is itself a very significant development. Our hope is that the spirit of collaboration that has brought together such a broad coalition of interests will remain well into a post-COVID future, serving music in NSW well into the future.

RIVMEO - Part 2

Recently we told you that OSANSW has helped in the formation of RIVMEO – a Roundtable representing the huge NSW music community.

The Roundtable includes organisations in the band, vocal and orchestral communities, music educators and their students, school and tertiary music education, major arts institutions and instrument repairers. It represents the biggest coalition of the music sector ever assembled in NSW and encompasses metropolitan and regional areas. The main aim of the Roundtable is to work collaboratively with each other and the government to find a way that we can all return to singing, playing and learning music together, safely.

Here is an update from the facilitator of the Roundtable, Stephen O'Doherty.

There's positive news. We have secured a meeting next week with the NSW Minister for Health, Brad Hazzard, and Chief Health Officer, Dr Kerry Chant. As well as representing the concerns of so many people about the effect of the current guidelines and restrictions on music, we will be exploring ways that we, as a music community, can play our part in the great public health challenge facing us all, while also returning to the musical activities that sustain the wellbeing of so many people of all ages in NSW.

The Roundtable is very grateful to have this opportunity, especially given the unimaginable load carried by these public officials in this pandemic.

The voice of our music community is being heard. We understand that the importance of music to community health and wellbeing is well understood and taken seriously in government circles.

Some professional arts companies and venues have been able to gain accreditation for COVID plans, and the Roundtable is drawing on their expertise. Some community bands have also been able to resume within the quidelines. These are hopeful signs. However, the lack of uniform application across different regions and local government areas is among the many issues on RIVMEO's agenda.

The task in front of us is not to be underestimated, but we must believe there is a pathway to a better future.
